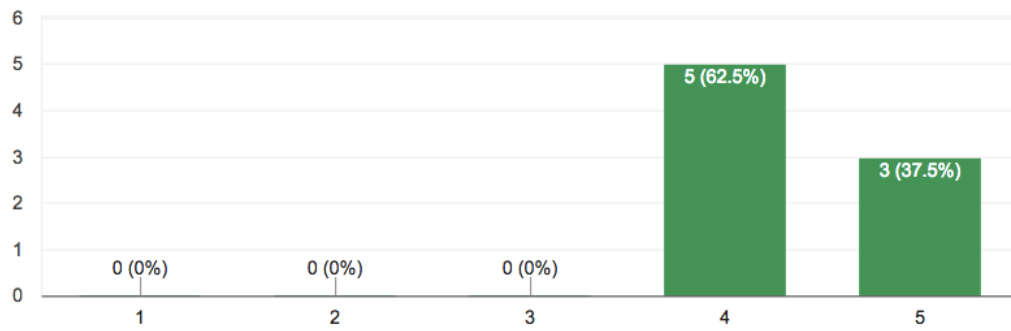


KCAA Summary of Survey Responses 10-13-17

1. How satisfied were you with the content of Curriculum Workshop #1: Airport of Opportunities?

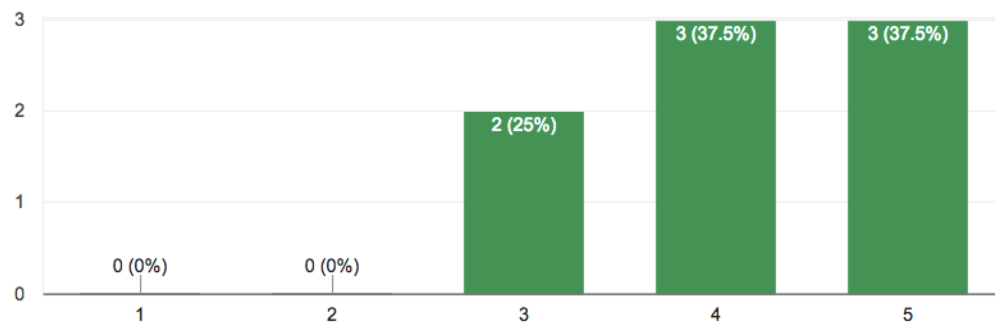

It clarified some of my thinking about what the challenges are in aligning what the state wants, vs what standards are vs what may engage the students... trying to balance all is tricky.

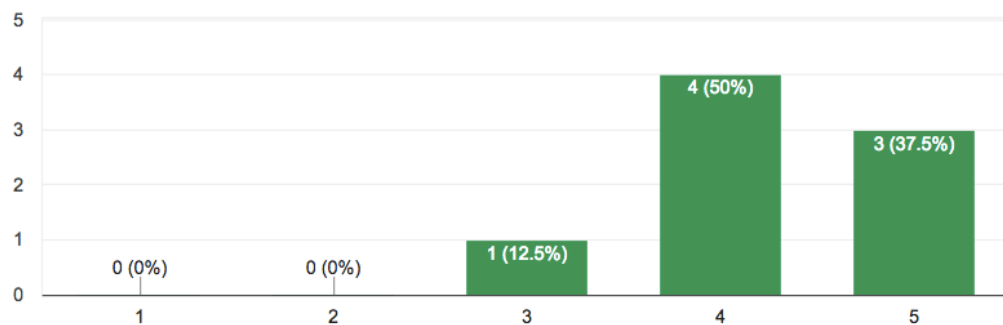
5. During the panel discussion, you heard recommendations for bringing Career-Connected Learning to scale. Is there anything else you think the panel participants should consider?

I would like to see some kind of technology implemented where students can apply once for internships and list their interests, and get connected to all opportunities instead of being dependent on a knowledgeable college/career advisor or depending on teachers to know contacts. This should be geared to equity so all students have the same opportunities.
